## An Established Partnership

The BCHDP-Arca Hosting Service provides low-barrier, sustainable, and standards-based hosting on Arca to past, present, and future British Columbia History Digitization Program (BCHDP) grant recipients, safeguarding provincial investments in digitization.

## 2022 Impacts



### Expanding Capacity for New Collections and Enhancing Metadata for Existing Ones

Established workflows for exporting content and metadata from alternative hosting platforms (e.g., PastPerfect) and ingesting into Arca for the BC Forest Discovery Centre and Alert Bay Public Library.

Coordinated metadata preparation for collections at four organizations for upload into Arca: Centre for Socialist Education, North Vancouver District Public Library, Société historique francophone de la Colombie-Britannique, and the Society for the Museum of Original Costume.

Refined *Name, Role, and Genre* metadata for all collections in the BCHDP child site in anticipation of the Arca-wide migration to Islandora 2.



### Raising Province-Wide Awareness

Co-presented a session titled “Connecting the Dots: Building support for GLAM partners in digital repository networks” with the administrators of the South Asian Canadian Digital Archive at the AABC/ARMA VI Joint Conference (Apr 23).

Launched la Société historique francophone de la Colombie-Britannique collections to B.C.’s Francophone community at the Fédération des francophones de la Colombie-Britannique Annual General Meeting (Nov 22).

Performing final remediation touches to collection metadata in preparation for the migration of the BCHDP child site to Islandora 2.

Following up with respondents to the previous Early Notice Survey who indicated an intention to apply in the 2024-25 grant funding cycle.

## 2022 Impacts

### Connecting Participants with the Right Support



#### Digitization Support

Connected two organizations, the Alder Grove Heritage Society and the Kaatza Station Museum and Archives, with the UBC and SFU Digitization Centres to digitize their materials, to be hosted on the BC Historical Newspapers and BC History Digitization Program (BCHDP)-Arca sites respectively.



#### Localized Support

Referred five grant applicants to localized Okanagan and Kootenay region digitization support with Arca's partner BC Regional Digitized History (BCRDH).



#### Expert Consultation

Connected two prospective applicants to more appropriate system partners for support: the Fifth (BC) Regiment RCA Foundation with the Archives Association of British Columbia and Tonari Gumi (the Japanese Community Volunteers Association) with the Nikkei National Museum.

### Streamlining Support and Communications

**New Support Website:** Launched the [BC ELN-BCHDP Support Service website](#) to provide convenient access to support materials including metadata templates, digitization guides by content type, tips for assessing copyright, and more; made by BCHDP contractors and student librarians.

**Amplified Notification:** Notified BC ELN partner libraries of the new BCHDP grant cycle and the new initiative for Indigenous applicants, resulting in Early Notice Survey responses from four BC ELN partner libraries.

**Project Management:** Created a more robust project timeline to ensure Support Service participants have enough time to inventory collections and incorporate feedback on drafts.

**Efficient Support:** Directed all communications and requests for support through a centralized inbox, ensuring more efficient triage of and response to inquiries.

# 2023-24 Participants

The BC ELN-BCHDP Support Service cycle begins with the Early Notice Survey sent out in early July. For the 2023-24 cycle, a total of 25 survey respondents indicated that they required some form of assistance to apply for BCHDP funding. Four additional prospective applicants reached out to either BC ELN or the Irving K. Barber Learning Centre (IKBLC) for assistance, independent of the survey. After assessing eligibility and referring some sites to appropriate alternative venues for support (e.g., BCRDH, IKBLC), the Support Service team assisted a total of 14 sites with preparing applications.
