WriteAway tutors bring a wealth of teaching and learning experience to their work providing feedback to students. Kaylee Magee, a tutor from Simon Fraser University, provides this insight into her work with WriteAway:

WriteAway is a great platform for developing my own teaching skills while still contributing to student development. Originally, the online interface posed quite the challenge for me: how can I build trust and generate a rapport with a student that I never see? Without the ability to connect with a student face-to-face, I had to develop new strategies to more clearly communicate writing ideas and concepts.

On a more personal level, the feature I enjoy most about WriteAway is the rare ability to assist students from multiple post-secondary institutions. It is very rewarding to know I am helping students from a variety of disciplines and majors, and always exciting to see what corner of the province each new paper is from!

What is WriteAway?

WriteAway is BC's collaborative online tutoring service. Learners receive feedback and strategies to improve their writing from qualified tutors. 15 participating institutions serve approximately 100,000 FTEs.

I think that this is a great service that more students should know about!

How Does WriteAway Work?



Student logs in and uploads a paper to the eTutoring platform.

Paper enters a queue on a first-come, first-serve basis. Tutor downloads paper from platform.



Tutor provides embedded comments and suggestions in student paper.

A message is sent to the student, indicating that their paper is ready for pick-up. Student picks up tutor response.

4 Tutor uploads their version to the platform.

Why Join WriteAway?



Extension of Institutional Learning Support

- WriteAway complements and extends in-house writing services to support distance students and those who prefer online services
- WriteAway is open 24/7 during the term; service goal is a 24-48 hour turnaround time



Established, Supportive Infrastructure

- WriteAway Administrative Centre provides central coordination, including tutor training, evaluation, service assessment, and promotion assistance
- BCcampus hosts eTutoring platform on privacy-compliant BC servers and offers technical support for the service



Financial Value

- Consortial software licensing of eTutoring platform saves participating members between 66-86% of the cost of independently-licensed online tutoring software
- A consortial approach saves participating institutions time and money by leveraging the expertise of an established community of practice

Achievements & Outcomes

WriteAway online writing support connects learners with expert help at point-of-need. The WriteAway Administrative Centre provides centralized coordination for participating institutions, saving them time and money.

Key Achievements

- Confirmed WriteAway support funding from BCcampus and Irving K. Barber Learning Centre, UBC
- Provided orientation, coordination, and support for four new WriteAway participating institutions Langara College, North Island College, University of the Fraser Valley, and Vancouver Community College, bringing fall 2015 participation to 15 institutions
- Reenvisioned BC eTutoring and WriteAway governance with the creation of the BC eTutoring Steering Committee to provide oversight for WriteAway and guide the development of collaborative online eTutoring services in BC
- Continued discussions with eTutoring consortia in Alberta and the United States to encourage reflection on and enhancement of service models, promotion, program assessment, tutor training, and communication with students
- Created WriteAway-specific tutorials, including online videos, to help new tutors become familiar with service expectations

Outcomes

- Students across the province have access to writing support, gaining vital skills for success in the classroom and in the workforce
- Participating institutions have clear directions on how to staff and promote the service, introducing valuable support to more learners
- Infrastructure and coordination is enhanced through centralized administrative and operational support provided by BC ELN, contributing to service stability and longevity



Engaging Community

Strengthening connections with regional, provincial, national, and international writing centres ensures that the WriteAway service is guided by research-based pedagogical and learning approaches. In 2016, WriteAway stakeholders, including members of the governance committee, institutional coordinators, and Administrative Centre staff will share their experiences at the Canadian Writing Centre Association conference. Participating in this type of knowledge exchange means that project coordination continues to be informed by contemporary best practice in writing support and educational fields.
